#### **ESJGWA Steering Committee Meeting Minutes**

#### Wednesday, September 9, 2020

Meeting called to order: at 8:32 am

The meeting was conducted via teleconference using Microsoft Teams. Reminders were provided to the attendees regarding meeting procedures.

#### **Roll Call taken:**

Roll call taken of members only.

In attendance were Chair Winn, Directors Mike Henry and Tom Flinn and Alternate Directors Mel Lytle; Walter Ward; Andrew Watkins and Brandon Nakagawa.

Others in attendance were logged via their sign in to Microsoft Teams.

#### **Discussion / Action Items:**

1. Approval of the August 12, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Motion: Director Mike Henry 2<sup>nd</sup>: Director Tom Flinn

Chairman Cuck Winn asked for any Noes or Abstains. With none provided, the minutes were approved unanimously.

 Resolution Authorizing the Secretary of the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority to Approve Expenditures and Execute Contracts within the Designations and Limitations of the Approved Budget Resolution.

Mr. Matt Zidar with San Joaquin County provided an overview of the Resolution to be reviewed and recommended to the GWA Board during October's Board Meeting, allowing for the ESJ GWA Secretary to approve expenditures and execute contracts within the designation and limitations of the approved budget resolution. Director Mike Henry asked for clarifications on the noted major and minor limitations to the authority. Mr. Zidar advised that major would be related to contract contingencies and the minor would be related to not cost time extensions or movement of budget with approved scopes of work. Alternate Director Mel Lytle stated that this authorization would be out of the norm and questioned if this authorization were to move forward, would notifications be made to the Board members when the secretary makes decisions. Mr. Zidar advised that such accounting and notification would be made part of the Staff and/or Secretary's Reports. Ms. Monica Streeter with Neumiller and Beardslee provided additional JPA details, stating that anything done within this Resolution would have to be within the Board approved budget. Ms. Streeter advised that if there are any issues, they needed to be identified so the Resolution could be adjusted. Mr. Zidar added that budget status reports will become included as a standing agenda item at future Board Meetings. Alternate Director Brandon

Nakagawa stated that as a process, the group enjoys the monthly Steering Committee Meetings and if there continues to be staff commitment on monthly check-ins with the Steering Committee on expenditures and progress, he will support the motion to approve. Chairman Chuck Winn stated that he was in agreeance with Alternate Director Nakagawa in regards to regular reporting of expenditures and projects.

Motion: Director Mike Henry

2<sup>nd</sup>: Alternate Director Brandon Nakagawa

Chairman Cuck Winn asked for any Noes or Abstains. With none provided, the motion was approved unanimously.

3. DWR Draft GSP Project Proposal Solicitation Package Overview and Discussion of Approach to Project Selection.

Matt Zidar provided information on the DWR Draft Grant Proposal Solicitation Package (PSP) for implementation of GSP projects, including information on the first round awardable funds and cost share details. Mr. Zidar provided additional details on the eligible projects and provided the DWR grant schedule. Ms. Chelsea Spier with DWR advised that the application submittal date would remain the same, but would open earlier, in November, due to DWR being ahead of schedule.

Mr. Zidar asked for discussion, from the Committee, on; 1) the potential process for selecting the preferred project, 2) who would review, rank and select preferred grant projects, and 3) what the criteria would be used to evaluate GSA projects. It was noted that only one grant proposal could be submitted from a basin but could include multiple GSA projects in the application. Director Henry questioned if the GSAs were eligible to submit their own applications or if the thought was to have the GWA apply. Mr. Zidar advised that the GWA would determine which project or projects would be submitted for the region. Secretary Fritz Buchman added that the group also needed to look at who would pay for grant preparation, who ultimately submits the application and would cover the required local cost share portion. Alternate Director Lytle question if DWR had put out anything regarding the ranking criteria and if the GWA had any projects on the list that were ready to proceed. Mr. Zidar advised that criteria was included in the PSP by DWR and that GSA have been requested to provide project status reports at monthly Steering Committee meetings and scheduled GWA Board meetings. Ms. Spier confirmed that while the Basin could only submit one application, that application could include multiple projects. Chairman Winn asked to clarify that it is possible to submit two or three projects that fall within the grant amount. Ms. Spier confirmed. Secretary Buchman additionally questioned if the grant could fund only the construction portion of the project, or if planning and design could be included. Ms. Spier advised that the grant could fund development, but not fully, it must also fund construction of the project.

Chairman Winn reminded the Steering Committee that the overall goal is to provide sustainability to the Basin and the question was what the best way to achieve sustainability. Additionally, Chairman Winn discussed the question of project priority and how to determine that priority, as well as having discussions at the Board level. Mr. Zidar provided the project criteria table, which prompted further discussion on there being any projects within the basin that are at a level needed to proceed with an application for the grant and be competitive in a statewide competition with other critically over drafted basins. It was noted that a project needed to have been included in the GSP. The discussion circled

back around to the need for GSAs to provide details on their project statuses. The GSA will likely need identify that there is funding for maintenance and operations if a grant is to be awarded. Chairman Winn advised that as updates have been requested from the GSAs, and that we may need to request the GSAs have their project details at the next Board Meeting. The Committee agreed that the project selection should be left to the GWA to accomplish, and that there was no recollection of earlier discussions regarding the decisions on basin priority projects. Mr. Zidar advised there would be communication with GSAs to get their project details, including where they were with identifying funding, providing a local fund matching and delivery timeline. Secretary Buchman suggested to obtain details on the GSA projects that could be completed within the three year timeline.

The Committee confirmed the application deadlines and when decisions would be made. Ms. Spier confirmed timeline of November 2020 to January 2021.

Mr. Zidar discussed a chat question from Gerald Schwartz, regarding if a current project could be expanded and considered a qualified project. The group advised yes, could be a well-defined phase of the complete project so long as the portion seeking funding would provide tangible benefits. Ms. Spier added that if the GWA did choose a piece of an ongoing project, that was okay but there would not be reimbursement until the project was completed. Mr. Zidar added that cost share could not be done via other State funds but could use Federal funds. Alternate Director Nakagawa suggested that these details be discussed further at the next scheduled Technical Advisory Committee Meeting. Alternate Director Lytle added that it is important that the application submitted is creative, allowing for it to be competitive.

#### **Staff Report**

1. Groundwater Management and Safe Drinking Water in the San Joaquin Valley. Analysis of Critically Over-drafted Basins' Groundwater Sustainability Plans.

Mr. Matt Zidar briefly reviewed the prepared Staff Report regarding Groundwater Management and Safe Drinking water in the San Joaquin Valley and included links to the referenced studies. It was noted by the researchers that prepared the reports that the small water systems, domestic wells and human right to water were not fully addressed in almost all of the GSPs reviewed. Alternate Director Nakagawa advised the group that he has been following discussions and trying to get more engaged on a long-term CV Salts program within the State. Mr. Zidar advised that more discussion to be had on the Watershed Coordinator position to coordinate with the RCDs when implementing the GSP. Secretary Buchman added that when developing the water quality portion of the plan, there was a decision made to not weigh into water quality issues that already had a regulatory process in place. Secretary Buchman noted that the County manages over 30 water systems that majority serve Disadvantaged Communities (DAC) and the County doesn't have any small districts or DACs that aren't able to remediate contamination issues. Alternate Director Lytle added that the City of Stockton is working on a project that will extend water service to additional areas with water quality issues. Chairman Winn added that he has been involved in Delta Counties discussions regarding concerns about salt water intrusion and future water quality. Chairman Winn questioned if there would be any discussions on the issue as it becomes more relevant. Mr. Zidar advised that there has been limited consideration of drinking water since the issues are a target of other state and local programs, provide benefits to a limited population, often are regulatory compliance nature (with private sector interests or operations), have high costs and have

therefore been a relatively low priority in light of the need to address overdraft which would benefit all parties..

#### 2. GSA Payments.

Matt Zidar provided an update on the status of GSA payments, stating that all invoices for the FY 19/20 6-month budget have been paid. Mr. Zidar advised that the invoices for FY 20/21 will be mailed to GSAs with two weeks.

#### **Public Comment:**

Ms. Chelsea Spier with DWR provided DWR program updates to the Committee. Ms. Spier provided details on an upcoming webinar hosted by Maven's Notebook and a Workshop pertaining to DAC and Tribal Engagement through IRWM.

No further Public Comments.

#### **Director's Comments:**

Director Mike Henry questioned the GWA moving forward in the application process for the Watershed Coordinator Grant and if any GSAs intended to apply as well. Matt Zidar advised that after some discussions, everyone was supportive of the application being submitted in partnership with the RCD by the GWA with the position being available to the GSAs to support outreach, monitoring and project development.

#### **Future Agenda Items:**

Matt Zidar provided some future agenda items based on meeting discussions. Items included providing regular monthly Budget and Project Status Reports per the Committee's request. Additional agenda items to include, recommending Resolution to the Board, Well Monitoring, DWR Grant Submittal Discussion and scheduled meeting for October.

**<u>Adjournment:</u>** Meeting was adjourned at 9:49 am by Chairman Winn.

#### NEW Statewide Groundwater Level Change Report and Maps Available

The <u>Spring 2020 Groundwater Level Change Report</u> and accompanying maps are available on the DWR website and present a summary of groundwater level data. The report and maps include a discussion of groundwater level trends with multi-year comparisons which can assist with the development of GSPs.

#### REMINDER Submit Fall Groundwater Level Data to CASGEM

Monitoring Entities for the California Statewide Groundwater Elevation Monitoring (CASGEM) Program are asked to submit fall 2020 groundwater level measurements to the CASGEM Online System (OS). The data is due within 30 days of collection, and no later than December 31.

#### SVSim Beta Model Released

DWR has released the beta version of the <u>Sacramento Valley Groundwater-Surface Water Simulation Model</u> (<u>SVSim</u>) that can be used during GSP development. Instructions for use are included in the <u>Roadmap to Running SVSim</u> document. A calibrated version of SVSim is expected in fall 2020.

#### C2VSim Fine Grid

Version 1.0 is under QA/QC and documentation is under review. This is expected to be released in early Fall of 2020. C2VSim is an integrated numerical model that simulates water movement through the linked land surface, groundwater and surface water flow systems in California's Central Valley using the IWFM modeling platform.

#### DWR is developing eight Proposition 68-funded technical projects

These projects include airborne electromagnetic surveys, improving groundwater elevation and quality monitoring networks, Statewide land use data collection, improved subsidence monitoring network, installing and maintaining stream gauges, maintaining and enhancing statewide well completion reports, managing and reporting sustainable groundwater information, and enhancing and maintaining DWR's modeling tools. #### Facilitation Support Services (FSS): Funding still available

- GSA's developing GSPs are eligible to receive funding for identification and engagement of interested parties, meeting facilitation, interest-based negotiation/consensus building, and public outreach facilitation
