Introduction & Background



Communication and Engagement (C&E) Plan – Background

Support Provided by DWR:

- Stantec, through DWR's Facilitation Support Services (FSS) Program, assisted the ESJGWA in updating its Communications & Engagement (C&E) Plan.
- The plan offers a menu of activities informed by 2023 and 2024 stakeholder survey responses.
- Development cost fully covered by DWR's Facilitation Support Services Program.

Public Engagement:

- Draft C&E Plan posted on November 20, 2024; public comment period ended on December 5, 2024.
- Sierra Club Delta-Sierra Group submitted two comment letters, attached to the staff report.
- Steering Committee recommended plan adoption on November 13, 2024.

Summary of 2024 Stakeholder Engagement Survey – Analysis and Results

- Most respondents (77%) indicated a strong knowledge of SGMA, while a smaller group (23%) knew less
- Most respondents expressed significant concern about groundwater levels and quality ranging from most respondents outlining being "extremely" and "very" concerned.
- Local GSAs and the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority (ESJGWA) were the most frequently accessed resources for groundwater information.
- Email was overwhelmingly preferred communication method followed by GSA meetings and U.S. Mail
- The most popular strategies for addressing groundwater issues were groundwater banking programs, and incentives for using available surface water. Comments reflected interest in increasing regional water supply through infrastructure projects and recycled water use.
- Respondents recommended improvements for GSP readability and accessibility



- GSAs are responsible for engaging their stakeholders, while ESJGWA-specific activities are outlined in the C&E Plan.
- The ESGWA and GSAs work together to tackle priority issues in 2025, including development and implementation of a web strategy for SGMA compliance.





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
