Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 – Key Terms

- SGMA = Sustainable Groundwater Management Act
- GSA = Groundwater Sustainability Agency
- GSP = Groundwater Sustainability Plan
- DWR = California Department of Water Resources
- ESJ = Eastern San Joaquin Subbasin
- **ESJGWA** = Eastern San Joaquin Subbasin Groundwater Authority





Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014 – Background


- Passed by Governor Jerry Brown in 2014
- Recognizes that groundwater management in California is best accomplished locally
- Does not change or affect surface water rights







Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014



Occurring throughout GSP implementation:

- Outreach and engagement
- Monitoring and adaptive management
- Projects and management actions

Maintain an economically-viable groundwater resource for the beneficial use of the people of the Eastern San Joaquin Subbasin by operating the Subbasin within its sustainable yield or by modification of existing management to address future conditions.







- Ensure SGMA compliance

ESJ Subbasin



Domestic Well Mitigation Program – Status Update

- Completed Actions
 - April ESJGWA Steering Committee Circulating Draft Domestic Well Mitigation Program
 - June ESJGWA Adopted 2024-2025 ESJGWA Annual Budget including \$100,000 for Program Mitigation Fund and \$20,000 for Implementation.
- Approval Process:
 - June 26 Stakeholder Workshop #1
 - August ESJGWA Steering Committee to Recommend Adoption
 - September 11 ESJGWA Board to Consider Adoption of Program for Inclusion in the 2025 GSP 5-year Update
 - June 2025 ESJGWA to Consider Funding Remaining \$100,000


