Introduction & Purpose of the Brown Act

The purpose of the Brown Act is to ensure transparency and public participation in local government decision-making processes. The Brown Act creates transparency that strengthens democracy

- •<u>Transparency</u>: The Brown Act promotes transparency by requiring that the actions and deliberations of local government bodies be conducted openly.
- •Accountability: Ensures that elected officials are accountable to the public by providing opportunities for public oversight and input.
- •<u>Public Trust</u>: Enhances public trust in local government by ensuring that decisions are made in a fair and open manner







Key Provisions of the Brown Act

Public Records	Open Meetings	Notice & Agenda Requirements	Public Participation	Closed Sessions		
Meeting materials, including agendas, minutes, and any distributed documents, must be made available to the public.	 All meetings of legislative bodies of local agencies must be open and public, allowing members of the public to attend and participate. A legislative body includes city councils, county boards of supervisors, school boards, and other local government agencies. 	 Agendas must be posted at least 72 hours before regular meetings and must clearly describe each item of business to be transacted or discussed. Special meetings require a 24-hour notice. Agenda items must be described in enough detail to inform the public about what will be discussed or decided. 	 Members of the public must be given an opportunity to address the legislative body on any item of interest to the public, before or during the body's consideration of the item. Public comment periods must be provided for both agenda and non-agenda items. 	 The Act allows for closed sessions in specific situations, such as personnel matters, pending litigation, and labor negotiations. Actions taken in closed sessions must be reported out in public sessions as soon as possible. 		



Recent Amendments & Updates of the Brown Act

AB 361 (Teleconferencing):

Expands the use of teleconferencing for meetings, especially during emergencies like the COVID-19 pandemic, with specific requirements for public participation.



AB 992 (Social Media):

Clarifies the rules regarding the use of social media by elected officials to prevent violations of the Brown Act through indirect communications.
